Life Education Van visit



It has been fantastic having The Life Education Van and Harold onsite during the past week. Students and staff alike have appreciated the expertise, perspective and programmes that the children are involved in.

Developing Childrens' Vocabularies

We want every child to enjoy environments in which words are not only noticed and appreciated, but also savoured and celebrated. From an early age, children can enjoy new or unusual words and use them in speech and writing. The key for parents is paying attention to what words mean – and how they work.

Phonology

For young children, learning about how words work begins with the sounds of words. You can play with sounds through activities like listening to and chiming in on rhymes and songs and clapping the syllables in long words and short words.

Orthography

This is the bridge between spoken and written words, and children can build words and notice what happens when they add and subtract letters – for example, set becoming sent becoming tent with the addition and substitution of letters. This can become a game to challenge the whole family.

Morphology

Children discover the meanings within words, often through Greek and Latin roots, for example, -er, -or, and -ist denoting 'someone who' as in dancer, actor, and naturalist, and -spect meaning 'to look at' as in inspect, inspector, perspective, retrospective, and spectacular. Children enjoy homophones like coarse and course, medal and meddle.

Syntax

Children enjoy exploring verb and noun forms, for example, inspire/inspiration, illustrate/illustration, getting the feel of parts of speech and how words can move from one use to another.

The first step is choosing high-quality reading books. You can look for and talk about the new words children encounter in books and can understand from their own experiences,

but may not hear or use in conversation. The next steps are introducing words in ways that help children make sense of them and getting children interacting with the words in interesting ways. Reading poems, singing songs, listening to the words in television shows and on the radio are all chances to spot new words.


SOME STEPS TO USE WITH A NEW WORD

- Explain the meaning of the word in the story.
- Repeat the word together several times.
- Write down the word so you can look at its shape and letters together.
- Think of other contexts or uses for the word.
- Use various forms of the word.

Use the word when you are talking and explain its meaning again if necessary

Thank you to Altrusa International of Ohariu for the coding books donated to our school library. Altrusa is a service organisation that was founded in the USA just over 100 years ago. They contribute to the community through hands-on service, literacy projects, fundraisers and international outreach. Altrusa International of Ohariu is a brand new club that covers a similar geographic area to the Ohariu electorate in Wellington.



Their project "Get set for a brighter future" aims to provide sets of literacy resources that empower women and children to develop new skills, extend their knowledge, and understand the opportunities that are created through education. Bus network review request

Metlink would like to engage with our community to promote a series of neighbourhood drop-in workshops. The workshops are designed to get customer ideas for improvements to the Metlink bus routes and services in Wellington city. They will look to address the rest of the region next year.

Just over a year ago some big changes were made to the Metlink bus network. They are now checking in with their customers to find out what is working well, and what still needs to be fine-tuned. There are still

some issues in some parts of the network, but the more detailed feedback they get from customers, the better they can address those problems.

Engagement is being organised by city area. They have just completed the engagement for the Eastern suburbs of Wellington city and now have a set of local neighbourhood drop-in workshops for Southern, Western and Northern suburbs. In addition there are two city centre drop-in workshops that cover all city areas, these are also for Eastern suburbs customers to have another chance to come and have their say.
