Physical Education:

Teachers in classrooms:

Just a reminder that teachers are in their classrooms from 8.30am - 3.00pm teaching and are unable to check their emails. If you have an important message to pass on to your child, please ring the office and let them know and they will talk to your child. The school phone number is 04 478 7074. Teachers aim to reply to emails within 3 working days. If the topic is urgent, please contact the office directly to have the message passed on.

Teachers are not always in their class until 8.30am every morning, due to organising their classroom programmes and/or attending meetings. With this in mind, we cannot guarantee there will be someone in the class to look after students who arrive early. If you need to drop your child off at school prior to 8.30am please contact Kelly Club who run a before and after school care programme in the school hall every day.

News day changes:

Recently we have been looking at the structure and purpose of our daily news programme. For Term 2 we will be changing our news programme to more of a structure where every day all students reflect on their learning and share thinking with other members of the class.

To support this change, at home it would be great if you could spend some time getting your child to think and reflect on the day. You could ask questions like

"What were you learning in reading?" (Or writing, maths)

"How did you find the work?"

"Tell me about what were you learning about in the afternoon?"

Name clothing:

It would be great if all of your children's clothing could be clearly named with first name and last name. Unfortunately, as the year progresses, we end up with a huge amount of lost property. Naming your child's clothing will help us reunite items with their owners.

Road Patrol:

Every morning and afternoon we have responsible Year 6 students who do Road Patrol for our school to make sure our families can cross our busy roads safely.
